## What Next?

- EDF aims to apply for a Development Consent Order (DCO) in 2020.
- Planning Inspectorate (PINS) has 28 days to decide if the application meets certain standards.
- PINS has 6 months to examine the application. Registered persons or organisations may submit comments and take part in hearings.
- PINS recommends the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy to approve or deny DCO. The Secretary of State has 3 months to decide.
- EDF must make a 'Final Investment Decision' when it has the money. Government may try a new funding model the Regulated Asset Base for nuclear. EDF has suggested UK energy customers could pay £6/year towards Sizewell
- Construction could begin by end of 2021.
